# Collection LBFRA: French linguistics and literature

## Collection

Within the collection French (LBFRA) the following sections can be distinguished: general subjects, French linguistics and literature, Occitan linguistics and literature, and 'France'. The library also has a substantial number of periodicals in subscription. In the **general** section (18.23) you will find dictionaries, bibliographies and general reference works on French language and literature.

The section **Linguistics** (18.24) contains material dealing specifically with French linguistics. Within this section, both historical and modern linguistics are well represented. Works dealing with general linguistics are to be found in the collection LBATW (General linguistics); works on communication in the collection LBCOM (Communication and Information Sciences).

The section **Literature** is divided into French literature (18.25) and French literature outside Europe (18.26). These sections contain a substantial number of literary histories as well as studies on literary genres, themes and motives. The primary and secondary works are arranged by period. Within the literature section, the focus is on medieval literature and on the 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> century. Here you will also find the literary works of the French philosophers. Their purely theoretical works can be found in section 08 (Philosophy) or in the collection LBALW (Literary Studies). Within the section French literature outside Europe, there are studies about 'littérature francophone' from Canada, the Antilles, the Magreb and Afrique noire. The accent here is on 'francophonie' and post colonialism.

The section **Occitan linguistics and literature** (18.27) is of national importance. The focus is on Occitan literature of the Middle Ages. More general and theoretical works in the field of literature can be found in the collection LBALW.

The library also has a large collection of studies on the culture of France. Books on the economic, social, cultural and political aspects of French society are in the sections 30 through 89 in the collection LBFRA. Books on the history of France can be found in the collection LBGES (History), section 15.71, 4280 (France); books on communication in the collection LBCOM (Communication and Information Sciences) and on film and media in the collection LBTHE (Theatre, Film and Television Studies).
