

Open Educational Resources Quality Model

Preconditions

In order to openly publish educational resources and increase their reusability, the University Library sets some conditions. The educational resources:

- are published under <u>an open license</u>*;
- observe the copyright of others;
- are provided with fully completed metadata fields** in the SURFsharekit;
- do not contain personal details.

* The selected license takes into account the licenses of the reused material ** The fields in the SURFsharekit are: Title, Summary, Keywords, Date of publication, Publishers, Discipline, (Degree) level, Language, Terms of use (CClicense), Authors and persons involved, Usage, End user.

Advice on form features

It is important that the material has a number of form features, for instance to promote reusability.

The educational resources:

- are <u>digitally accessible</u> for users with disabilities: use is made of voice-over and subtitles, images have alt-texts, the font is clear, colour blindness is taken into account etc.;
- offer enough documentation so it can be reused by others;
- contain hyperlinks that can be accessed by everybody;
- are provided with the UU logo;
- are provided with a date;
- are available in both Dutch and English;



- contain good-quality audiovisual components (images, text, video, audio etc.): readable, intelligible, without spelling errors, enough definition, etc.;
- are easy to navigate;
 - suitable for use on several devices (laptops, mobile phones, tablets, etc.);
 - are offered in accepted file formats (.mp4, .docx., .pptx, etc.);
 - coherent materials are linked within the publication platform (see: <u>User manual SURFsharekit</u>).

Advice on didactics

The educational resources

- have clearly formulated learning goals or learning outcomes;
- contain activities, testing and/or information that match the learning goal(s) or learning outcomes;
- contain feedback at activities and testing;
- contain information (theories, concepts, views etc.) that are supported by sources.
