



# Checklist Entry Requirements

## Cultural Anthropology: Sustainable Citizenship

**This form is NOT required for students with a Bachelor's degree:**

- Cultural Anthropology from a Dutch Research University
- Liberal Arts and Sciences from Utrecht University with a specialization in Cultural Anthropology. Please note, students from UCU are required to fill in the form.

**For all other students, submitting this form is mandatory.**

In the scheme below you have to show the Admissions Committee how you have acquired each competency by listing all relevant academic courses.

For everything you list, you need to submit official course syllabi (including information on course content, learning goals, weekly schedule, etc.) that prove that the course content is indeed relevant.

You can upload this form and the supporting documents via the application process in Osiris Online Application.

Please note:

- The courses need to be listed on your transcript or on the overview of courses yet to be completed.
- You need to upload official course syllabi or weblinks in English or Dutch. Realise that the Admissions Committee is unfamiliar with your specific curriculum. Via course syllabi the content of a course can be verified.
- In case the Admissions Committee is unable to verify the course content, it will not be taken into account in the assessment of your application file.
