

Checklist Entry Requirements

Youth, Education and Society

This form is NOT required for students with a Bachelor's degree:

- *Pedagogische Wetenschappen* at a Dutch research university
- *Onderwijswetenschappen* at a Dutch research university
- *ALPO* at Utrecht University

For all other students, this form is mandatory.

In the scheme below you have to show the Admissions Committee how you have acquired each competency by listing all relevant academic courses.

For everything you list, you need to submit official course syllabi (including information on course content, learning goals, weekly schedule, etc.) that prove that the course content is indeed relevant.

You can upload this form and the supporting documents via the application process in Osiris Online Application.

Please note:

- The courses need to be listed on your transcript or on the overview of courses yet to be completed.
- You need to upload official course syllabi or weblinks in English or Dutch. Realise that the Admissions Committee is unfamiliar with your specific curriculum. Via course syllabi the content of a course can be verified.
- In case the Admissions Committee is unable to verify the course content, it will not be taken into account in the assessment of your application file.

1. Background in social sciences

You have knowledge and insight into theories and perspectives from the social sciences.

Please list the academic courses in social sciences (totalling at least 19.5 EC) or other relevant experiences which prove you meet this competency.

2. Pedagogical theories and related social issues

You have knowledge and insight in the areas of childrearing and development theory, important pedagogical issues in society and the fields of operation for pedagogy.

Please list the academic courses related to this subject (totalling at least 15 EC) or other relevant experiences which prove you meet this competency.

3. Field knowledge

You have knowledge of methods and strategies concerning practical development, practical innovation and policy processes, including the structure of the pedagogical and educational fields.

Please specify how you meet this competency. This may include academic course(s) or field experience with a similar in-depth level to a Bachelor's degree, such as extra-curricular research, relevant training, work, internship, volunteer work, etcetera.

4. Communication skills

You have the communication and other social skills required to perform well in an internship in this field.

This will be determined, among other things, by your motivation letter. You do not have to hand in other documents.

5. Research and academic skills

You are able to set up and implement an analysis of a social-pedagogical issue (key questions, background, considerations and avenues of solutions) and can report on this both orally and in writing. You have the necessary skills in the area of social science research methods and techniques, such as specific methods of social science research and reporting on research results.

- a) Specify whether you have written a Bachelor's thesis or other research report that proves you have experience with empirical scientific analyses, research design, research practice as well as reporting about research.

- b) Specify how you have knowledge about basic statistics and quantitative research methods, such as univariate descriptive statistics, correlation, univariate regression, and one-way analysis of variance. for instance via academic course(s)

- c) Specify how you have in depth knowledge about **one of** the (more advanced) research methods below:
- *multivariate analysis*, including at least 1 of these analyses: factor analyse, multiple regression, MANOVA, Structural Equation Modeling and the ability to use these tools in SPSS or similar statistical programme
 - *(advanced) qualitative methods and analysis*, such as ethnography, observation techniques, discourse analysis, digital ethnography, design research, or other qualitative methodologies.
