How Conviction can Wrong the Guilty

As a theory of criminal law that combines both retributivist and restorative elements, Antony Duff's theory of communicative criminal law is widely celebrated as one of the most significant contributions to the philosophy of criminal law of the past decades. The theory includes a theory of the criminal trial as a process that calls alleged offenders to account: in his keynote lecture, Duff will explain the implications of this theory for the procedural rights that all accused persons should enjoy, including especially those who are guilty.
