

Checklist Entry Requirements

Youth Development and Social Change

This form and uploading the course syllabi is NOT required for students with a Bachelor's degree in:

- Interdisciplinary Social Sciences (ISW) or Psychology at a Dutch research university.
- Pedagogical Sciences or Educational Sciences at Utrecht University.

For all other students, this form AND uploading the course syllabi, is mandatory.

In the scheme below, you have to show the Admissions Committee how you have acquired each competency by listing all relevant **academic** courses.

For everything you list, you need to submit official course syllabi (including information on course content, learning goals, weekly schedule, etc.) that prove that the course content is indeed relevant, or you can link to the online course syllabi in this form.

You can upload this form and the supporting documents via the regular application process in Osiris Online Application.

Please note:

- The courses need to be listed on your transcript or on the overview of courses yet to be completed with the same name as listed in this transcript.
- You need to upload official course syllabi or weblinks in English or Dutch. Realise that the Admissions Committee is **unfamiliar** with your specific curriculum. Your provided checklist and course syllabi are how the Admissions Committee verifies your academic competences.
- In case the Admissions Committee is unable to verify the course content, it will not be taken into account in the assessment of your application file.

1. Scientific theories on Youth

You meet this requirement when you have completed at least **10 EC** in Bachelor courses on the broad topic of youth.
