

B5: Asking for attention for diversity subjects

How can you provide input for policy as a diversity network?

A diversity network usually represents specific interests of one or more diversity groups. The goal is to improve the well-being, opportunities and possibilities of such groups within Utrecht University. Throughout the year, three moments are organised in which a network can provide input:

- Two half-yearly meetings of the diversity network with the [Diversity Network Coordinator](#)
- The annual All Diversity Networks Meeting

Every year, the [Diversity Network Coordinator](#) presents the state of affairs in the [EDI Steering Group](#) and discusses the points of attention. This way, we ensure that current matters receive the attention they deserve.

Additional attention by organising an activity

The organisation of [an activity](#) within one of the Diversity Months of Utrecht University (March and October) helps to direct attention to a subject and ask for additional attention for it.
